"We take the unique needs of each patient — from youngsters to senior citizens, and focus on precisely what they require to achieve and maintain a healthy mouth and teeth. And we never, ever, try to convince them to do work that they don't need to have done."

State-of-the-Art Restorative and Cosmetic Dentistry

Dr. Crumpton and his friendly, skilled staff offer a full range of services including cleaning, sealants, tooth-colored fillings, and periodontal therapy to help fight gum disease.

Dr. Crumpton specializes in mouth restoration. From single tooth fixes to advanced full-mouth rehabilitation cases, his patients benefit not only from his experience and skill, but also from his use of advanced technology. Remember when tooth restoration meant multiple, inconvenient visits to the dentist for a full or partial crown? Not when your dentist is Dr. Crumpton! He uses a chair-side ceramic tooth restoration technology called CEREC 3D, which allows him to restore a tooth in a single visit. In fact, Dr. Crumpton has become so accomplished in CEREC 3D tooth restoration that the company now has him teach other dentists how to use the technology as well as apply it in private practice.

According to Dr. Crumpton, "It's simply the best porcelain restoration on the market right now." And you will find that these advanced



capabilities and products are reasonably priced compared with other offices that offer the more traditional multiple-appointment process.

Dental implants and implant restoration are other treatment option areas of Dr. Crumpton's. If a tooth is lost, the tooth root can be replaced with a tiny titanium post anchored in your jawbone. A small titanium piece is placed on top of the post, then a porcelain crown is cemented to it. The result is a crown that looks, feels and functions like your natural teeth.

The office uses digital X-rays that emit about one-eighth the amount of radiation of traditional dental X-ray machines. Not only is this better for the patient, it also allows the doctor to manipulate the X-ray image and increase contrast, making it easier to see small details like cavities beginning between the teeth. Also, patients can expect to see photographic images taken from inside their mouth using an intraoral camera. Dr. Crumpton enjoys the fact that, "It allows patients to see exactly what work needs to be done, which in turn helps set their mind at ease."

Dr. Crumpton stresses the importance of patient convenience and comfort. "We offer pre-op sedation options for fearful patients plus patients can listen to music and watch movies as we perform our work," explains Dr. Crumpton. "If a patient requires multiple services or has a complex case that requires extensive work, we strive to minimize the number of visits by performing as many of the procedures as we can during a single office visit."

Education and Patient Understanding

Patient education plays an important role in the services Dr. Crumpton delivers. He and his staff take the time to explain to each patient what they need, why they need it, and the outcome to expect.



Dr. Crumpton even takes pictures of each individual tooth he intends to work on, shows the pictures to the patient and explains the situation in detail. Then the patient views videos that explain why the work needs to be done and what the outcome should be.
